

Fabulous Frida

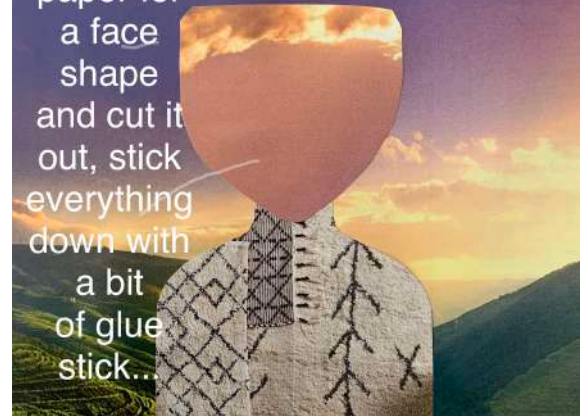
If you've been following along with The Man Who Knows Everything (and his brilliant brain) then you'll know that today is "Frida Friday" (it's a thing, promise.) Here's how to make your own Frida portrait!



Start by finding a pretty landscape and then cut some shoulders from a magazine - the Argos or IKEA catalogues are great for this!



Next find a bit of coloured paper for a face shape and cut it out, stick everything down with a bit of glue stick...



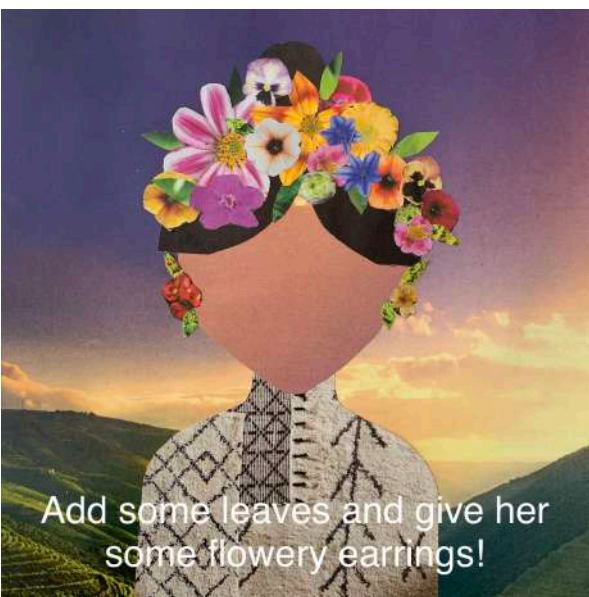
Add Frida's hair shape out of some black and stick it down



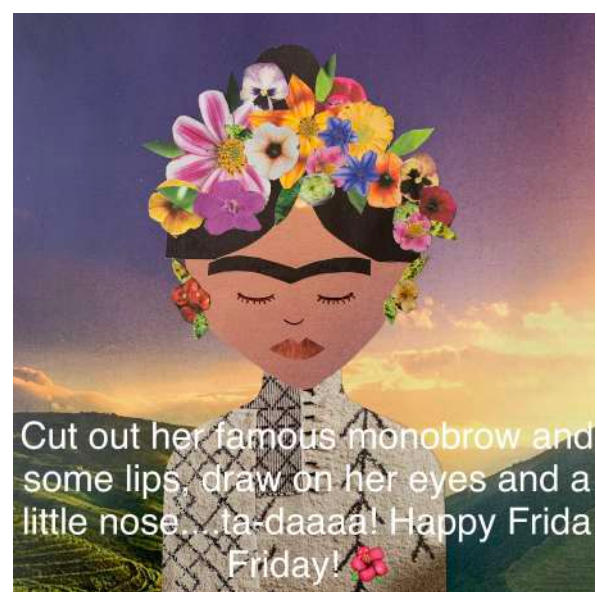
Now you can cut out flowers from a magazine or plant catalogue for her flower crown, stick them down when you're happy!



Add some leaves and give her some flowery earrings!



Cut out her famous monobrow and some lips, draw on her eyes and a little nose. Ta-daaaa! Happy Frida Friday!



Garden Gatherings



Make a natural portrait with some bits you can gather while you're outside; (don't pick the flowers unless you have permission!) you'll need some sticks, grass, maybe a few petals or little bits of twigs or leaves.

Arrange them 'till you're happy and then glue them down.



He'ART Attack!

Here's another ingenious way for you to use those toilet roll tubes!

1.   Flatten your loo roll, and cut it into strips

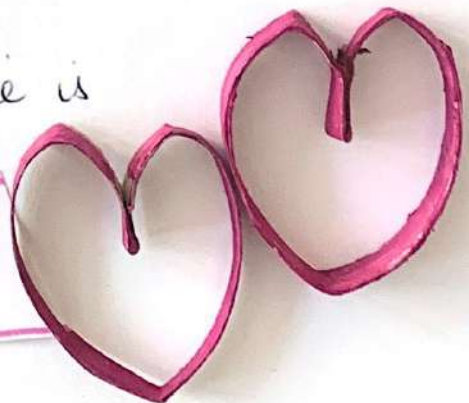


2. Using a bit of glue, or some sellotape if you have some, bend and stick your slices of tube into heart shapes. You might need to borrow a peg while it sticks (if you used glue!)



3. Now you can stick some together, add a message, or colour them in - the choice is yours!

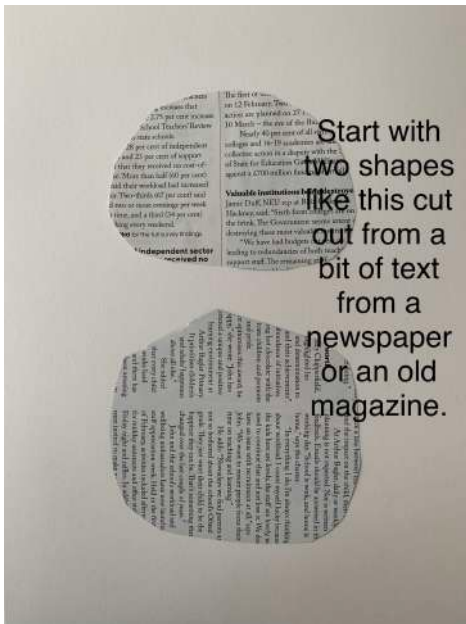
Scrap paper dog



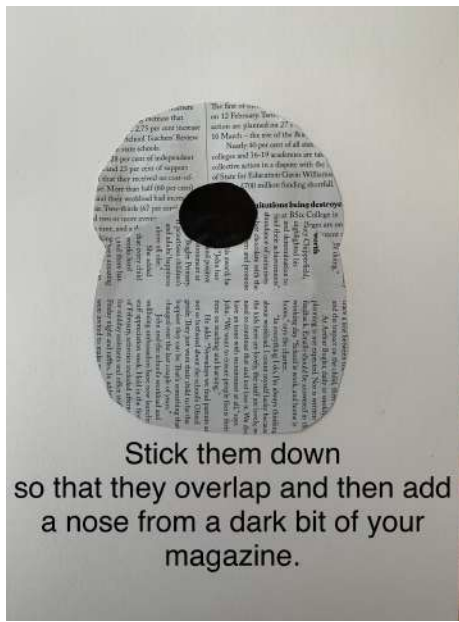
Collage yourself a pet!

I used a very boring Teacher magazine, but a newspaper or a bit of junk mail would work, too!

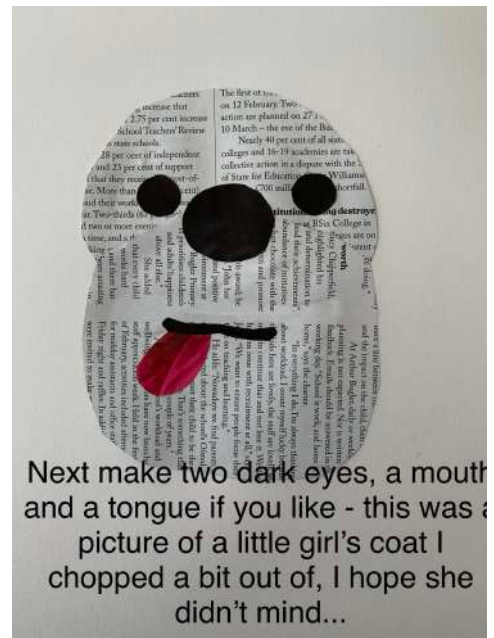
We would love a dog; what sort of dog would you have? Think up a name for yours, mine would be called "Pepper" 🐾



Start with two shapes like this cut out from a bit of text from a newspaper or an old magazine.



Stick them down so that they overlap and then add a nose from a dark bit of your magazine.



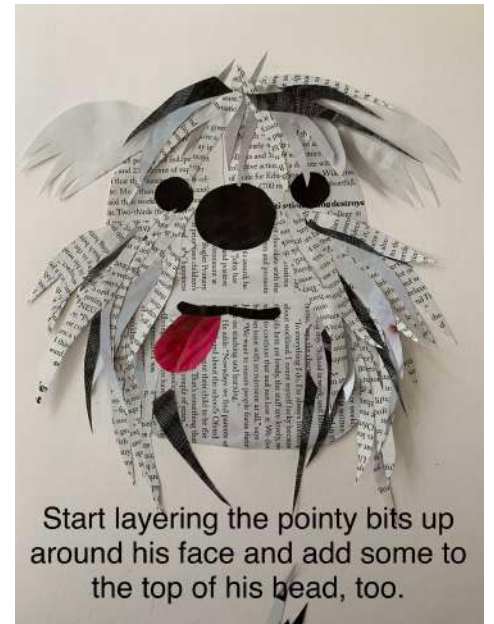
Next make two dark eyes, a mouth and a tongue if you like - this was a picture of a little girl's coat I chopped a bit out of, I hope she didn't mind...



Next is the bit where he starts coming to life a little; you're going to need some spiky bits to make his hair and whiskers...



For this bit you're going to need lots of pointy bits of coloured paper from your magazine. I mean LOTS. Cut some and then cut some more!



Start layering the pointy bits up around his face and add some to the top of his head.



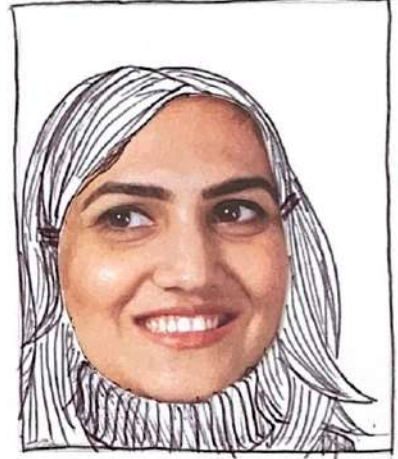
Keep going; the more you put on, the better your dog will look!



See what I mean?

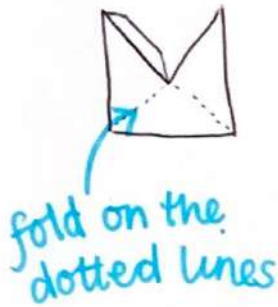
Hair Stylist Scribbles

Make a Cosy Corner

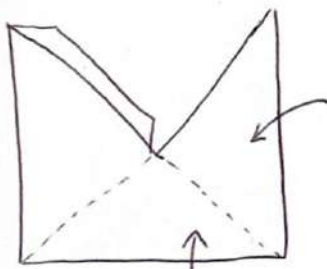
1. Cut a piece of paper into this shape:



you can do it really easily by folding diagonally to make a square from a piece of A4. Fold it twice and make a tab so you can stick it into a 3D shape. (that's later, don't do it yet!)

2. Now it's your chance to be creative (and do a bit of Interior Designing!) and choose some things you would put into a room. Look in the IKEA catalogue or a magazine.

Stick them all down while your 'corner' is flat.



Include a chair that looks comfy and some pictures for the walls.

Don't forget to add some flooring

3. You can draw in anything extra you might need, like a plant pot or a clock or some things from your own house. When you're ready, stick to the tab and create your 3D room.



Loo Roll Dino



Here's another loo roll idea to have a go at.



1. Flatten your roll and mark on the shape of your dinosaur



2. Cut out your dinosaur shape - you might need some help with this - if not, great job!



3. Now, stand up the dino - you might have some paints, or you could colour him in, or even collage with some green bits from a magazine!
